Margaret's Village Envisions A World Where Everyone Has A Warm Bed & A Safe Home.

- 106,000 Chicagoans are housing insecure
- 5,390 people living on the streets or in shelters, a 2 percent increase over 2019.
- Nearly 80,000 Chicagoans are impacted by homelessness, either living on the streets or are in and out of temporary housing.
- Of those coping with street and shelter homelessness, 78% identified as Black.
- 16,451 Chicago Public Schools (CPS) students experience homelessness.

Our Impact

More than 29,000 nights of shelter, 105,000 meals and 2,300 case management contacts per year.

Permanant housing



Our on-site case managers provide holistic and individualized services to each individual that arrives, including care coordination and referrals for legal assistance.



Education and Training

Spirits are lifted when program participants enjoy music, art therapy, and attend writing workshops that promote healing and improve communication skills. Our expressive arts programs are a superb method of reaching those impacted by trauma, and often unresponsive to other types of therapies.

Job Security



Through partner agencies including
Cara, Goodwill Industries of
Metropolitan Chicago, Jane Addams
Resource Corp. and others, we facilitate
job training, coaching and employment
placement.



Health & Safety

We coordinate with the University of Chicago Medical Center and Heartland Health Alliance.



We often say that we are ending homelessness one person at a time. In the case of our families, we end the cycle of homelessness.



Paulette, a former resident of Maria Shelter, today lives on her own, works at an international automotive company, and worked hard to receive her Bachelor's degree in 2018. She says:

"Maria Shelter changed my life. I have known the feeling of prison doors closing, but I have been blessed to know what it is like to have the doors of Maria Shelter opened for me. Walking through those doors is not just about a place to sleep—it is about hope and promise."



Last June, Denise received her Bachelor's degree. She and her children were residents of Maria Shelter more than a decade ago. Not only does she have a good job, and a degree, but her oldest child is now enrolled in college as well. In this case, we helped a single mother get back on her feet, but the reality is we probably have prevented her children from a lifetime of poverty, too.

Education provides skills needed to get a steady income, and tools that are essential to being a critical thinker and good citizen.


